Designer and showroom owner DAN MARTY brings a worldly collection of art and antiques into his cosmopolitan apartment in the landmark Villa d'Este



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Interior designer and showroom owner Dan Marty filled his Los Angeles apartment with furniture from his own line and antiques picked up on his European travels. His two Napoléon III chairs (at left) and three antique chairs are paired with small Syrian tables and an antique chinoiserie desk. Collections of oil paintings, coral and books add a personal layer.



"I love putting collages together," says Marty. "The dining room has lots of maps of Paris, two old Eiffel Tower drawings and a painting of Notre Dame." A Paul Ferrante pagoda lantern hangs above an antique table, and Laurel chairs from Marty's line are covered with vintage linen. The drapery stripe is from Rogers & Goffigon. **opposite** Marty's apartment is housed in the 1920s building Villa d'Este.





clockwise from top left Original antique Moroccan and Italian tiles line the stair risers. Marty displays his collections, including boxes, blue-and-white Chinese vases and coral branches, in vignettes throughout the apartment. An antique French mirror, a chinoiserie box, African beads and an antique apothecary jar are grouped together on an antique sea-grass-and-bamboo dresser in the master bedroom. "I'm constantly creating outdoor environments that are equal to indoor spaces," Marty (opposite, with his dog, Sam) says of his private walled garden.
