Letter from the President

Happy holidays to all of you. As I indicated at the annual meeting, 2022 has been a year of doing things and a year of looking forward.

We had very successful author visits including William Kent Krueger, who 170 people came to the Barn at Stratford to hear. He is a true gentleman, and I can't wait for his next book. And Sara Nisha Adams helped us think through her "Reading List".

We restarted things that we had stopped during COVID including Young Writer's Workshops and book sales. We had great responses to both of those, and we are glad to be getting back to normal.

The library is going through changes that began in 2022 – a new Director, Bryan Howard, was hired to replace retiring director, George Needham. We truly miss George, who was our mentor and our friend, but we look forward to working with Bryan.

The new Liberty Library is opening in 2023, and it is affecting us as well as all of Delaware County. Our offices will move from Orange Library to Liberty Library, and we will have book sales at Delaware and Liberty Libraries instead of Orange Library. Our Friends room at Liberty will look like a bookstore with books shelved rather than boxed and shoppers better able to find their favorite books.

The Friends launched a fund-raising drive to furnish the Maker Studio in the new Liberty Library and to help keep the equipment updated in both Liberty and Delaware Maker Studios. The Friends are going to have more changes next year. Our current Treasurer, Cheryl Stagg and our Fund-Raising Chair, Brad Cowan, are both going off the board in 2023. Cheryl was instrumental in "professionalizing" our accounting system and our bookkeeping process. Thank you, Cheryl.

Brad has totally revolutionized our book sale process. We have evolved from boxes on tables to bookshelves that we can stock and sort into more categories than "Fiction" and "Non-Fiction." With a volunteer group that is not as young we "used" to be, not having to carry boxes full of books is definitely a step in the right direction.
